

# **Athy Parish Centre**

Kildare County Council has granted planning permission for the renovations and change of use for the Athy Parish Centre. The building was formerly used as a Resource Centre and school. As well as making the building wheelchair accessible by the inclusion of a new access ramp and wheelchair accessible toilets, the renovations will involve some internal alterations.

While awaiting the granting of planning permission, the community part of the building has been developed over the last year. Slaintecare are renting the two prefabs behind the building. Kildare Travellers Association, Athy Photographic Society, Childcare Solutions are also renting rooms. The building is also being used by Anchor Youth Club, Irish dancing classes, art classes, the Knitting Group and various parish groups. Conor McCann, the

Parish Pastoral Worker has his office there.

Again, we thank the Sisters of Mercy for their wonderful gift to the Parish of Athy. Now that planning permission has been granted, we hope to continue to develop the building for the benefit of the parish and the wider community Patricia Halligan has been appointed Athy Parish Centre Manager on 1<sup>st</sup> June. Until the work on the alterations of the Parish Centre are completed, she will continue in her present role as Parish Secretary.

# CATECHETICAL CORNER - OREMUS!

Let us pray, in Latin Oremus is a call to prayer, we are being invited to pray, invited to focus on what we are doing and why we are gathered. It is usually followed by a moment of silence and recollection, allowing us time to focus and remind ourselves where we are and what we are doing.

The "Collect" is a prayer that concludes the opening rites of the Mass. It is sometimes, wrongly called the Opening Prayer, as it closes the introductory rites of the mass, rather than opens. The collect invites people to pray in silence for a moment, and then offers a prayer to God that is drawn from the readings or feast of the day, or the purpose for which the Mass is being offered. A collect is simply a prayer meant to gather the intentions of the people and the focus of worship into a

Similarly, The Prayer Over the Gifts itself concludes the Preparation of the Gifts, and serves as a kind of 'bridge' or transition prayer to the great Eucharistic Prayer that follows. The priest invites us to pray but it differs to the Collect in that the invitation to pray and to be recollected comes in a slightly different form, namely: "Pray, brethren [brothers and sisters], that my sacrifice and yours be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father." The priest does not say 'Let us pray' but rather 'Pray'

The assembly/congregation responds with: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church." This is the purpose of our coming to mass, to offer praise and glory to GOD, which is for our good and the good of the whole Church. This simple prayer, which is often overlooked or mumbled without thought, sums up the reason we are gathered. The Priest, with arms extended then recites the prayer over the gifts.

After communion we spend some time in silent prayer and or sing a psalm or song of praise. Thank God in our own words for all the blessings in our life, naming them specifically. Allow your heart to fill and overflow with gratitude. The Priest then recites the Post Communion prayer/ The Prayer after Communion. This prayer is meant to "collect" together all of our individual prayers.

These three particular prayer moments within the Mass; the Collect, the Prayer over the Offerings and the Prayer after Communion:, serve to call us to recollect why we have gathered and what we are doing when we gather. Take to time to notice them, they are often, if not always, very beautiful.
