## CATECHETICAL CORNER - "USE IT OR LOSE IT"

Next week we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King, commonly called the Feast of Christ the King. It is the last Sunday in the Church's liturgical year, the following Sunday being the first Sunday of Advent, is the beginning of a new liturgical year. At this time of year, the readings at Holy Mass can all seem quite scary and a little bit daunting. They are all about the end times and the terrible suffering that is supposed to take place.

The prophet Daniel tells us: "There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence." The Gospel tells us "...the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken..." That all seems quite scary. And indeed, if that is our focus, then it is scary and we scary. And indeed, it that is our focus, then it is scary and we should be very worried. But if we keep our focus on GOD "Like the eyes of a slave on the hand of her master" (Ps. 123:2) we have nothing to worry about. Again, Daniel tells us not to worry, "your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book." The Gospel reaffirms that "...He will send the angels to gather His chosen from the four winds." We are being called to have faith. To trust GOD that HE will be faithful to HIS promise to us. We are "His chosen", our names are "written in the book" by virtue of our Baptism. Faith is hard, especially in the face of adversity, when there is

war and so much suffering. Some will say that "faith is a gift and I just don't have it." And that is true, faith is a gift given by GOD, which we were all given at our baptism. And while faith is a gift it is also a virtue, one of the three great gifts, the Cardinal Virtues, of Faith, Hope and Charity/Love (see 1 Cor. 13), and as such, it requires nurturing. If we don't nurture something it dies. Virtues are no different, the law of atrophy applies. What does that mean? Well put quite simply: "Use it or lose it." If we don't foster, practice and use the virtues we will lose them, they will become swallowed up by whatever it is that we do practice. become swallowed up by whatever it is that we do practice; doubt, fear, selfishness. Think about it for a moment. If you are a person of Faith, then say things like: "I trust GOD, everything will be ok." If you are a person of Charity/Love, then practice that love towards others. St James says: "that faith without good works is quite dead." (Jas. 2:17). Practice Faith, practice Hope, practice Charity. If we do not practice them, then, just like our physical muscles, by the scientific law of atrophy, we will lose them.
