NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT CONTINUES

Recalling the example of the disciples after the Ascension, who persevered together in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Archbishop Farrell has asked all Catholics across the Archdiocese to continue the nine day through the Feast of Pentecost (Sunday 19th May), ending on the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church (Monday 20th May). Our Novena to the Holy Spirit is a crucial part of the Building Hope pastoral renewal process of prayerful listening, dialogue, planning and action. Pope Francis encourages times such as these of prayerful reflection, listening and sharing, so that we can better hear the voice of God's Spirit, to help direct the Church into the future. CATECHETICAL CORNER - GOD'S TOOLBOX

Imagine what that must have been like, to be present in that room, when it shook, there was a loud noise and then there were tongues of fire. Wow, how scary must it have been? Scary but exciting.

At some point, and perhaps more than once, we have probably all said something like: 'If only I had lived when Jesus was on earth, it would just make it easier to believe.' And yet so many didn't believe and of those that did, many walked away from Him having followed Him for some time. The beauty of living after the time when Jesus was walking around on earth is that we have 'access' to Him all the time through the Sacraments. We are not restricted to making sure that we are in the same place as He is or that there aren't too many people in front of us.

Jesus knew that it would not be easy to be His follower, in fact He said that we will be hated on account of Him. (Mt. 10:22) But to make it easier He gave us a tool box. Filled with various tools to help us to navigate our way along the 'narrow path'. The tools in the box are the gifts of the Holy Spirit. And like all tools, they are intended to be used. These tools are: Wisdom: we learn how to make good decisions; Understanding: we come to know the mind and heart of God. Right Judgment (Counsel): we can put into practice what is in the mind and heart of God. Courage: (Fortitude), enables us to stand up for what is true and what we really believe. Knowledge: we come to know God in our heart. Reverence (Piety): we give honour, respect and praise to God. Wonder & Awe in God's Presence (Fear of the LORD:), we are aware of who we are in the presence of GOD and just how 'other' GOD really is. Why do we need these gifts? The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says this: "The moral life of Christians is sustained by the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These are permanent dispositions which make man docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit." (CCC #1830) These gifts are given to us at Baptism and Confirmed at confirmation. Today, the feast of Pentecost, might be a good time to reflect on how
