### CATECHETICAL CORNER - "OH GRACE..."

At the General audience in Rome last Wednesday Pope Francis continued his weekly Catechesis. He spoke about what it is to be a good, a virtuous person.

He said that virtue is the practice of the art of controlling our passions, such as greed, anger, lust, impatience etc...in order that we not be ruled by them. Pope Francis said: "However arduous this may be, the human being is made for goodness, which truly fulfils him [her], and [s]he is also able to practise this art, causing certain dispositions to become permanent in him or her." The virtuous person "is strong, courageous, capable of discipline and ascesis.'

It is this permanence that defines virtue. So, virtue, being a good person, is not defined by random good acts, "even criminals have performed good deeds in moments of lucidity". The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines virtue as: "...an habitual and firm disposition to do the good" (CCC #1803). The Pope continued: The virtuous person therefore does not become warped by distortion, but realistics faithful to be the following faithful to the contraction of the period of his [her] own vocation, fully realising himself [herself]. Perhaps this is what Jesus meant when He said: "I have come that you may have life and have it to the full." (Jn. 10:10) Or what St Irenaeus meant when he said: "The glory of GOD is [the human person] fully alive."

So, you see to be virtuous, to be a good person, is what it means to be a child of GOD, made in the image and likeness of GOD (see Gen. 1:27). Our vocation is to live our lives trying to make that our daily reality.

The Pope recognises the difficulty in being virtuous, while pointing out: "What a happy world it would be if justice, respect, mutual benevolence, kindness of heart and hope were the shared normality, and not a rare anomaly!" So how can we attain this virtue?

The Holy Father states that first and foremost it is the action of GOD, the work of the Holy Spirit, grace given to us at Baptism. It is this grace that acts in us, arousing our own desire to live virtuously. Grace is GOD's gift. The Catechism says this: "Grace is favour, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive [children], partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life." (CCC #1996) The Catechism goes on to say: "Sanctifying grace is an habitual gift, a stable and supernatural disposition that perfects the soul itself to enable it to live with God, to act by his love. Habitual grace, the permanent disposition to live and act in keeping with God's call..." (CCC #2000)

However, grace is a gift which does not override our free will, we must cooperate with grace if we are to realise it. Living a sacramental life and a life of prayer is how we cooperate with Grace, enabling us to live with God.

Holy God, You have made us all members of the body of Christ, the people of God, and poured into our hearts the abundant gift of your
