CATECHETICAL CORNER – A TIP FROM JOHN LENNON

At the weekly audience on Wednesday last, Pope Francis continued his 'cycle of catechesis'. Last week he gave an overview of what it is to be virtuous, pointing out that virtue 'is the art of controlling our passions'. This week he began looking at particular virtues, beginning with Prudence. Why prudence? Because it is has been referred to as; "the coachman of the virtues". In other words, Prudence drives all of the other virtues.

The Holy Father began his catechesis by pointing out that prudence is not the virtue of the nervous person, hesitating to act. Neither is it merely exercising an 'abundance of caution', a phrase we have heard often this past week. No, the Holy Father said that "...prudence means that the action of man is in the hands of his intelligence and freedom. The prudent person is creative: he or she reasons, evaluates, tries to understand the complexity of reality and does not allow him or herself to be overwhelmed by emotions, idleness, pressures and illusions."

Quoting St Thomas Aquinas, the Holy Father said: "It [Prudence] is the capacity to govern actions in order to direct them towards good..." He continued: "The prudent do not choose at random: first of all, they know what they want, then they weigh the situation, seek advice, and with a broad outlook and inner freedom, they choose upon which path to embark." Does this mean that those who exercise the virtue of Prudence do not make mistakes? Of course not! The Holy Father acknowledged this fact, but said that exercising Prudence helps "avoid major setbacks". The Pope also said that the prudent person can be a good counter-balance to "too much zeal" which he said, "in some situations can cause disasters". He said that the Prudent person has an eye on the past for "tradition is a patrimony of wisdom". While also having an eye to the future; "Once one has decided on the goal to strive for, it is necessary to obtain all the means to reach it."

The Holy Father concluded his catechesis with this wise insight: "The Christian life is a combination of simplicity and shrewdness. Preparing his disciples for the mission, Jesus says: "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves" (Mt 10:16). As if to say that God does not only want us to be saints, he wants us to be intelligent saints, because without prudence it takes but a moment to make a wrong turn!"
